



HOME / SCHOOL AGREEMENT

It is the wish of all involved at Swallowdale Primary School to provide for its pupils a happy, safe and stimulating environment in which they can develop both intellectually and socially. We aim to encourage children to aim high, respect each other and instil a love of learning and a pride in all they do. We believe that a positive partnership with parents is crucial and will promote our vision 'together we fly high'.

The School will:

-  Encourage children to do their best at all times.
-  Provide a balanced, stimulating and relevant curriculum.
-  Recognise expected behaviour and celebrate success through our behaviour policy.
-  Inform parents of their child's progress through regular meetings and end of year reports. Day to day communication is facilitated in a range of ways including: Twitter, newsletters, notes in 'Home/School Link' books, phone calls, texts and emails.
-  Inform parents about what the teachers aim to teach the children each term through the 'Termly Information for Parents'. Additional information about English and Maths will be sent to parents as appropriate.

The Family will:

-  Make sure that the child arrives at school on time (8.35am for KS2 and 8.50am for KS1) and is not left unsupervised in the playground before school. Make sure the child is collected on time (3.05pm for KS1 and 3.10pm for KS2) by an adult whose name appears on the 'pick up' list. Inform the school if someone, other than those on the list, is collecting the child.
-  Make sure the child attends school regularly and provide a note or contact the School (via telephone, email or using the Schoolcomms app) with an explanation, if the child is absent.
-  Support and adhere to the school's policies for behaviour, homework and school uniform with all uniform (including PE) clearly labelled.
-  Attend meetings that are relevant and involve their child.
-  Let the school know of any problems which may affect the child's learning.
-  Adhere to the School's social media policy
-  Take responsibility for personal property brought into School as the School does not hold insurance to cover the loss or damage of such items and they are brought in at your own risk.

The Child will:

-  Learn to uphold/follow School values.
-  Do their best, making every effort to produce class work and homework of a high standard.
-  Be caring and considerate towards others.
-  Have respect for their surroundings both inside the classroom and outside in the school grounds.

'Together' we will:

-  Address any additional educational needs.
-  Encourage our children to uphold the School values, to stay safe and enjoy learning.
-  Support each child's learning to help them achieve their best.

Parents are expected to discuss the home-school agreement with their child and to sign below before returning it to the class teacher.
